

### 1 Key Vocabulary

- Emperor** The ruler of an empire.
- Legion** A large section of the Roman army, made up of 5000 soldiers.
- Roman empire** The name used for the land that was controlled by the Romans, including parts of Europe, Middle East and North Africa.
- Anglo-Saxon** **Farmer-warriors who lived in Britain over a thousand years ago.** Made up of three tribes who came over from Europe, they were called the **Angle**, **Saxon**, and **Jute** tribes.
- Invader** **Invaders are people who use force to enter a place and take over, usually with an army.**
- Settlement** **Settlers are people who go to live in a place, with the aim of staying there permanently.**
- Artefact** An artefact is a man-made object, such as pieces of art or tools, that is of particular cultural, historical or archaeological interest.

**The Colosseum is the largest Roman amphitheatre ever built.** It stands in Rome, Italy, and building started around AD 70 and was completed in AD 80.



In the ship burial at **Sutton Hoo**, the dead person had a big **shield** leaning up against the wall at the head of the burial chamber. It had a diameter of 91½ cm. It was curved like the glass in a watch

### 3 Important people I will learn about...

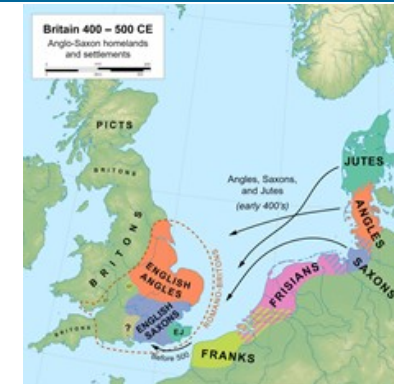

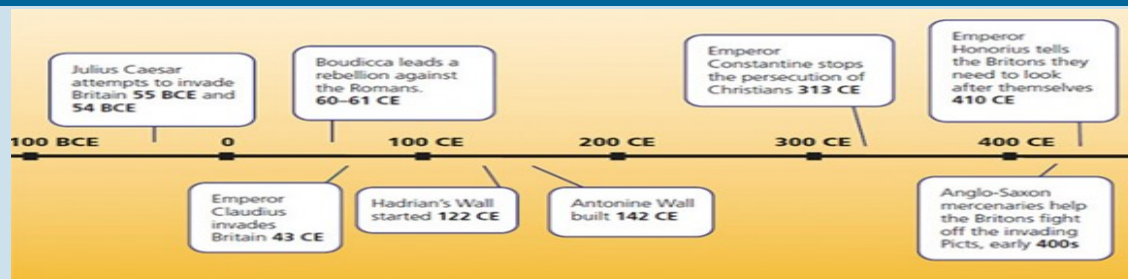


**Raedwald** might be the king entombed in the ship burial at Sutton Hoo (near Woodbridge, Suffolk, England).
